

Preceptorship for Infectious Diseases Clinic at the University of Udine in Collaboration with Academy srl (CME Provider) and Pfizer Global Medical Grants

Request for Applications (RFA) Gram negative Infections: from Laboratory to Patient's bedside (Kill Bad Bugs 4.0)

The University of Udine in collaboration with Academy srl (CME provider) and Pfizer Inc are pleased to offer two (2) five day training sessions, held at the Infectious Diseases Department, University of Udine during the calendar years 2018 and 2019. These in-depth, hands-on training sessions for doctors in Europe who are responsible for the care of infectious disease patients (specifically those with gram negative infections) at their home institutions have been developed by faculty at the University of Udine in collaboration with Academy srl, independent of Pfizer. Pfizer is supporting the program via an educational grant, and will cover travel and accommodation/some sustenance expenses for selected trainees (please note that the cost of all food and beverage and other sundry items will **not** be covered).

Training will consist of clinical observation, one-on-one faculty instruction and didactic learning modalities to increase the knowledge and competency with all aspects of the management of patients including with gram negative infections: epidemiology, rapid microbiological testing, mechanisms of resistance, antimicrobial stewardship, old and new therapies, pneumonia, sepsis and management of gram negative infections in immunocompromised patients.

Interested trainees should submit a qualification worksheet application (attached) and a current Curriculum Vitae (CV) to the following email address: IGLC@pfizer.com. Please note you must acknowledge your availability for one or more sessions and you must currently practice medicine in one of the target geographies.

The University of Udine and Academy srl will evaluate all applications and will make all final selection decisions. If you are accepted into the first session, you will be notified by 24th October 2018. Those accepted for the second session will be notified after the first session has been completed. Information on travel arrangements and visa requirements will be provided at a later date.
