- This should be followed by the TITLE and the type of presentation (lecture, poster, video, DVD)
- The abstracts should be approximately 300 words (without space) structured by subheadings: introduction, aims, materials and methods, results and conclusions
- All the accepted abstracts will be published in the Book of Abstracts

You will be contacted by the Scientific Committee of the World Congress by 15th January 2007 whether or not your abstract has been accepted.


