

Academic Olympics

Invitation to participate in UENPS Congress "Global Neonatology and Perintology" to present results of research efforts and at the same time compete in sportive, leisurely, joyful manner for Gold, Silver and Bronze Medals in the "Academic Olympics".

Conventional Congresses have hundreds of presentations of scientific efforts and results, one after the other and in parallel. However there is no acknowledgment, no recognition of and no award for the scientific efforts for the individual apart from some prizes for example for the best poster. This UENPS Congress is based on a new idea, on a systeme of acknowledgement and recognition of scientific excellency. Why should Olympic Games only take place for sportsman and sportswoman? Why should academics and scientists not compete and for their scientific and academic efforts be awarded with ranks such as Gold, Silver and Bronze Medals?

This Congress introduces and offers a fair competition for Worldwide academic recognition named "ACADEMIC OLYMPICS".

Each country's scientific and academic community is invited to participate by motivating its best members of its scientific community, its best doctors, researchers, lecturers to UENPS Congress Global Neonatology and Perintology and "Academic Olympics". Academic Olympics participants must be less than 40 years of age at November 1, 2008.

For the first round, so called primaries, participants will be grouped according to WORLD REGIONS:

- Australia & New Zealand
- China
- India
- Europe
- North America & Canada
- Africa & Arabia
- Eurasia (Russia, Turkmenistan etc.)
- South and Central America
- East & South Asia (Japan, Korea, Philippines, Thailand, Indonesia etc)

Each region will have 10 presentations/presenters, selected according to submitted abstracts, in ONE hall. From each region the BEST will be in the finals and compete amongst the 9 regions' representatives.

The finals then consist of 9 speakers and a "global jury", consisting of one member of each World Region (Australia & New Zealand, China, India, Europe, North America & Canada, Africa & Arabia, Eurasia [Russia, Turkmenistan etc.], South & Central America and East&South Asia). This global jury with its nine members will judge the speakers.

On grounds of:

- A. innovative research
- B. didactic quality of presentation
- C. impact on neonatology or perintology

The jury will award the three best ones of a country or region with Gold, Silver and Bronze Academic Medal of AO and determine the RANK 4th to 10th.


Apart from the Gold, Silver, Bronze and Ranking, UENPS intends to organize and offer a postgraduate period for the winner(s) in a renowned university.

About Rome

Rome is the capital city of Italy and of the Lazio region, as well as the country's largest and most populous comune, with more than 2.7 million residents.

The metropolitan area has a population of about 4 millions people. It is located in the central-western portion of the Italian peninsula, where the river Aniene joins the Tiber.

The State of the Vatican City, the sovereign territory of the Holy See is an enclave of Rome. It is the smallest nation in the world, and the capital of the only religion to have representation in the United Nations (as a non-member observer state).

Rome, Caput mundi ("capital of the world"), la Città Eterna ("the Eternal City"), Limen Apostolorum ("threshold of the Apostles"), la città dei sette colli ("the city of the seven hills ") or simply l'Urbe ("the City"), is thoroughly modern and cosmopolitan. As one of the few major European cities that escaped World War II relatively unscathed, central Rome mantains a character reinaissance and baroque essentially. The Historic Centre of Rome is listed by UNESCO as a World Heritage Site.

Airport Information

Rome can easily be reached by plane and is served by two international airports. Participants can fly into Rome via Leonardo da Vinci Airport, located in Fiumicino, 34 km from Rome's historic city centre or via Ciampino Airport, situated 15 km southeast of central Rome.

Access to Rome from the Airports

Access from Leonardo da Vinci Airport:

The airport is served by the Leonardo Express train operated by Trenitalia, available at the airport terminal. The trip takes 30 minutes (no stops) to Termini Station in Rome - there are two such connections per hour. Alternatively, local trains leave once every 15 minutes, stopping at all train stations. You may have to change at Trastevere, Ostiense (Metro Piramide) or Tuscolana. Rental cars are available in the airport terminal from all the usual companies.

Access from Ciampino Airport:

There is no rail transport at Ciampino Airport. The options are to take a bus to a rail station (either metro or regular train) or to take a bus or taxi all the way.

All the way by road transport

• Terravision runs a direct bus service to Termini. The price is \in 8,00 ca. one-way or \in 13,50 ca. return, taking 40 minutes (about 20 services a day). Despite timing buses to connect with flights, passengers on the return trip from Termini are asked to board the bus 2.5 hours before their flight's departure time. The last bus is at 7:20 pm. Terravision also offers buses from Fiumicino airport to Termini, and a transfer bus between the two airports.

• Schiaffini also runs direct buses to Termini station for \in 5,00 one-way, taking 40 minutes, but with far fewer departures than Terravision (see above). These buses are not mentioned on the airport website but they can be found on Schiaffini's own site.

• BusShuttle runs a service similar to Terravision. Their stop near Termini is about 20 metres up the road from Terravision's. Cost is \in 6,00 for a single.

• The fixed fare for a taxi ride to the city centre (inside the Aurelian Walls) is \in 30,00, according to the official agreement between Roman taxi driver associations and Rome municipality. It is advisable to negotiate the total price including luggage supplements before boarding the taxi. Rental cars are available in the airport terminal from all the usual companies.

By public transport – Follow the signs for "Metropolitana B", Laurentina direction. Get off at Piramide station and reach the platform of the train for Fiumicino. Take the train for Fiumicino and get off at Muratella station. At this station there will be a shuttle service for the Congress venue.

From Leonardo da Vinci Airport:

By taxi – We recommend you to only use licensed taxis available outside the station. The estimated cost of one-way journey to join the Rome Marriott Park Hotel is \in 35,00.

By public transport – Follow the signs for "Station" of Leonardo express. Take the train for Fiumicino and get off at Muratella station. At this station there will be a shuttle service for the Congress venue.

By car - Hotel Direction: 11 NE - Driving Directions: Roma-Fiumicino Highway, exit to G.R.A. Firenze. Once on the G.R.A., exit 31-33

From Ciampino Airport:

We advice to take a taxi available outside the airport. The estimated cost of one-way journey to join the Rome Marriott Park Hotel is \in 50,00/55,00.






