

The Focus Sessions will examine clinical practical situations as well as various intervention imaging cases that every cardiologist should experience.



These sessions address the needs of practicing cardiologists, focusing on patient-oriented clinical decision-making. Experienced clinicians will present cases and discuss diagnostic and therapeutic options with the audience in an interactive manner. 
