### **Educational objectives**

As general practitioners (GPs) are the lead clinicians in primary care, the major objective of this postgraduate course is to **update** GPs during the **academic plenary sessions** on latest findings in cardiovascular medicine and to **debate** during the **practical ask the expert sessions** most relevant applications for daily practice. 
