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Travel information

Planes arrive at Ferihegy Airport, Budapest (25 km from the centre). There is a service for minibuses to the city centre (Erzsébet tér= Elisabeth Square or Deák tér=Deak Square), to the Western Railway Station (Nyugati Pályaudvar) for HUF 2.100 (about EUR 8). Trains to Szeged leave from the Nyugati Palvaudvar (Western Railway Station). The railway station is easily accessible by metro (underground/blue line, #3). If you wish to come by train to Szeged we recommend you to use an InterCity (IC) train. One way IC train ticket costs HUF 3.800 (EUR 15). The travelling time is about 2.5 hours. Please check the timetable carefully; in general there are no trains to Szeged later than 18.38h. Szeged can be reached easily by car from Budapest via Kecskemét using the M5/E75 road (approximately 170 km on the motorway, toll HUF 1.400 / EUR 6).
