One of the themes of this year's Network conference is: "Spine Health" with special sessions on Back Pain with a Multidisciplinary Approach and a Research update. In addition there will be joint sessions with Patient Advocates and Network Coordinators on Health Economics. The BJD Strategic Plan for continuing beyond 2010, which was globally adopted in Durban, 2006, with a focus on regionalisation will be further outlined in breakout sessions. The final agenda is well under way and will be sent closer to the conference.

The Patient Advocacy Seminar will begin on Thursday, October 11, with the theme "Health Economics: Understanding the Data and How to Use it in Advocacy". On Friday morning, October 12, there will be a Public Walk to celebrate the International Arthritis Day. The Network Meeting itself will take place on October 13 and 14, Saturday and Sunday.

A joint scientific, *The Alf Nachemson Symposium on Back Pain* in collaboration with the Australian Orthopaedic Association (AOA) will be held on Friday afternoon.

There will also be a combined osteoporosis symposium and in addition Prof James

Waddell, NAN Coordinator, Canada, and his group will present to AOA the *Young Investigators Initiative*.

International Steering Committee meeting

The BJD International Steering Committee met in London on 1 - 3 June, 2007. The meeting was focused on discussing an Action Plan for the BJD Strategy – How to move forward after 2010. Under this theme it was decided until 2010 to Establish BJD Regional Councils in each of the world regions, which will help existing national networks to continue their work as part of a larger group within their region. It was also decided to formally cooperate with OMERACT on WHO/BJD/OMERACT guidelines for musculoskeletal conditions. The discussions will continue in Australia in October.

On the same occasion the International Steering Committee (ISC) had the chance to meet with the UK BJD network, ARMA to discuss the group's current projects and challenges within the current climate of change in the UK National Health Service. ARMA - the Arthritis and Musculoskeletal Alliance - is an umbrella association bringing together 33 UK support groups, professional bodies and research organisations within the musculoskeletal field.

JAPAN:

Translation of musculoskeletal comic book.



As a part of the education campaign aiming to promote prevention of musculoskeletal disorders and improve the "quality of life" of people, a publication on the musculoskeletal system was issued in 2005 in the popular Japanese comic book style to target especially elementary school children.

This comic book, written and edited by several students of The University of Tokyo, has been highly praised by a number of professors internationally. With a request for its distribution in other countries, translation of the comic book into English is in progress, and it is expected to be finished in time for presentation at the 2007 BJD Annual World Network Conference to be held in Australia. In an effort to raise awareness among children, plain words and expressions are being used, with a focus on children's point of view, leaving high expectations of leading to the healthy growth of children around the world.

Prefectural steering committees

During the Bone and Joint Decade, efforts by the Japan Steering Committee to promote understanding and health of the musculoskeletal system in Japan have been largely concentrated only in the major urban areas. However, from 2007, the Japanese Ministry of Health and Labour has recognised the importance of the musculoskeletal health and has included it for the national population in its official policy. Accordingly, this presents a great opportunity to help expand activities to more outlying areas throughout the country. Toward this end, the Japanese Network has recently set up prefectural steering committees in each of the 47 prefectures throughout Japan, and at present they can report that each committee is now in place. The next step will be to activate each of the committees to carry out seminars and other activities in their respective areas.

Model project of school medical examination

The Japan BJD Steering committee has been actively promoting inclusion of musculoskeletal medical checks among the items of the mandatory health checks carried out in Japan's schools. They have been working on developing a simple set of items for the check. These include

preparation of a check up sheet to be filled out by parents for the students and checklists to be used by school doctors, most of whom are physicians and paediatricians, so they must be made easy to understand and use for non-orthopaedic surgeons. Since 2005, musculoskeletal medical checks have been carried out at some schools in four prefectures as a test in advance of an expected inclusion by 2010 of such checks among the mandatory national school medical check system.
