





THE RESILIENCE OF MIND AND BODY CONGRESS ATTACHMENT AND TRAUMA

The development of the human brain, personality and body are determined, as we all

know, not only by what happens in each individual's life, but also by the way the brain and the body react to it. The resilience of the human mind and, from a more general perspective, of the nervous system – which extends throughout the body – depends, of course, on innate qualities, but also, and most importantly, on the early relational and emotional experiences that the infant makes all over the course of the developmental process.

Furthermore, on the one hand, our speakers will give an in-depth overview of the different obstacles that prevent the human mind and body from recovering from traumatic experiences; on the other hand, they will explore the most effective treatments in the field of psychotherapy to help patients who feel "imprisoned" by their psychological traumas and to support them in increasing their resilience, removing any obstacles to the natural evolutionary pathway of their lives, and moving to a new chapter in life.

Every year, more than one thousand participants, coming from 40 different countries in the world, met in Rome to attend the past three editions of the Congress "Attachment and Trauma", which many of them have defined "an historic event in the field of trauma-related psychotherapy".

The fourth edition of the Congress, "Attachment and Trauma – The Mind and Body Resilience", will take place in the heart of London, at the prestigious Queen Elisabeth II Conference Centre, uniquely situated in the shadow of the Big Ben, Westminster Abbey and the London Eye.
